Dear Colleagues,

I am pleased to share the 2024–2025 Undergraduate Enrollment Report for the Twin Cities campus.

This past year has been marked by significant achievements, reinforcing our commitment to attracting, enrolling, and supporting talented undergraduate students.



Key Highlights:

- Strong Enrollment: We welcomed a robust undergraduate student body totaling 31,855 students, including 7,391 new first-year students—the largest first-year class since 1965. We also saw our new transfer student enrollment rebound to 1,747 students. Almost 70% of our undergraduates are Minnesota residents.
- Academic Excellence: Our incoming class demonstrated strong academic credentials. Of those who attended schools that provided class rank, more than two-thirds were in the top 25% and more than one-third ranked in the top 10%. About one out of every 11 of those students finished high school as the class valedictorian. Furthermore, the middle 50% of students who submitted standardized test results scored 1320-1470 on the SAT and 26-31 on the ACT.
- **Commitment to Inclusivity**: A broadly diverse student body continues to be central to our mission. This year, 25% of first-year students will be the first in their family to graduate from college, and 28% qualified for Pell Grants.
- Geographic Reach: Our undergraduates represent 107 countries worldwide, every state in the U.S., and 86 of Minnesota's 87 counties.
- Student Success: Our first-year retention rate remained impressive at 91.4%, underscoring our continued focus on student success and academic achievement. Our four-year graduation rate held strong at 71.3%, which is far above the national average.

These accomplishments highlight our continued strength in undergraduate enrollment and our dedication to fostering an academically rigorous, inclusive, and supportive educational environment.

Thank you to our many campus partners and the dedicated faculty, staff, students, alumni, and supporters throughout the state of Minnesota whose efforts contribute significantly to our ongoing success.
















Transfer Enrollment
