

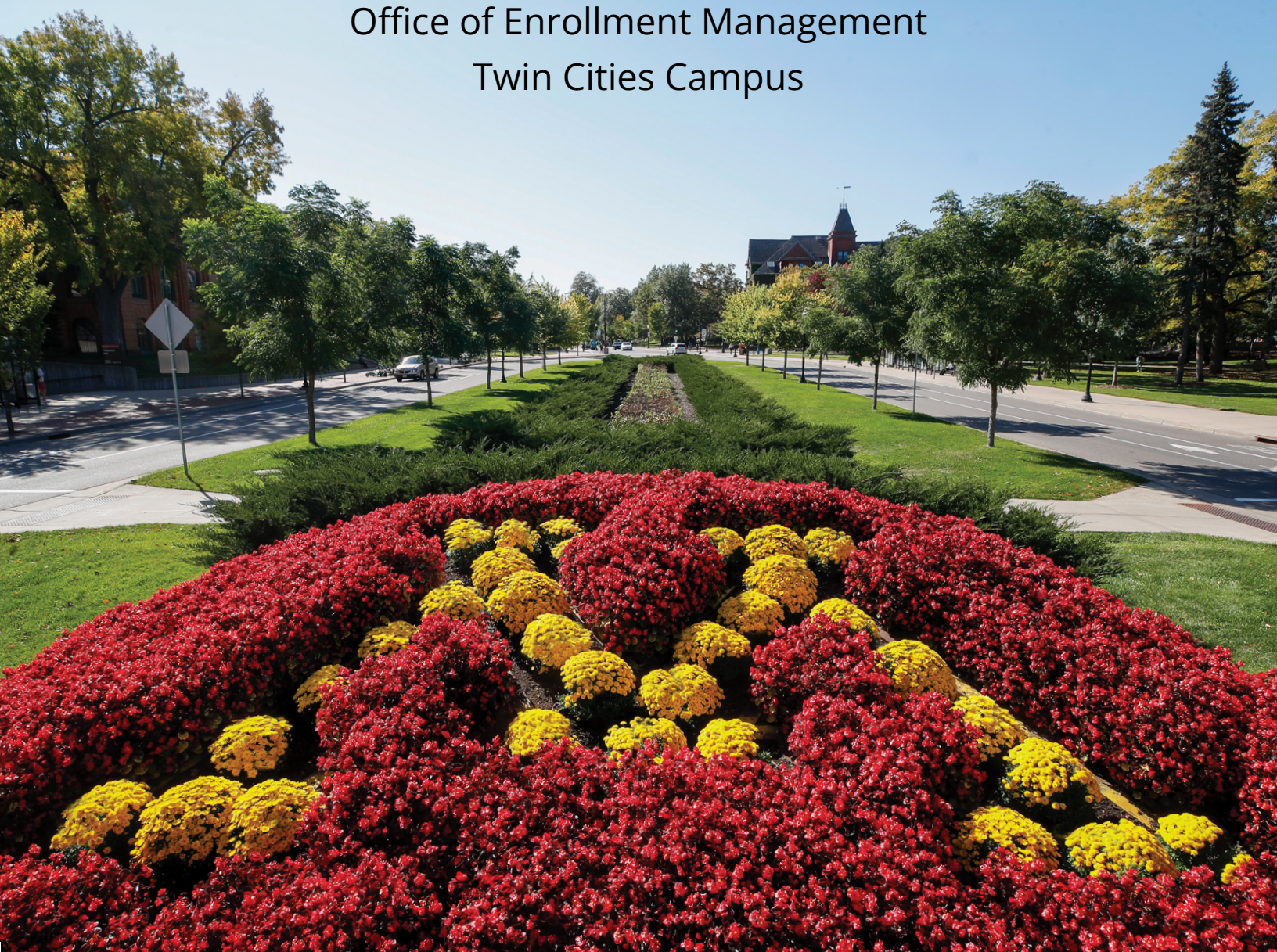

Dear Colleagues,

I am excited to present the 2025–2026 Undergraduate Enrollment Report for the University of Minnesota's Twin Cities campus.

This past year has been filled with remarkable milestones, underscoring our dedication to attracting, enrolling, and supporting a talented and diverse undergraduate class.



Key Highlights:

- **Strong Enrollment:** We welcomed an undergraduate community of 32,632 students to campus this fall, including 7,180 new first-year students and 1,843 new transfer students. Nearly 70% of our undergraduates are residents of Minnesota.
- **Academic Excellence:** Our incoming students have made impressive academic achievements. Among those whose schools reported class rank, over two-thirds ranked in the top 25% of their class and more than one-third were in the top 10%. About one in ten students graduated as their class valedictorian. For those submitting standardized test scores, the middle 50% range was 1310-1460 on the SAT and 26-32 on the ACT.
- **Commitment to Inclusivity:** Building a broadly diverse student body remains central to our mission. This year, 25% of first-year students will be the first in their family to graduate from college and 27% qualified for Pell Grants.
- **Geographic Reach:** Our undergraduates come from 115 countries around the globe, all 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and 86 of Minnesota's 87 counties.
- **Student Success:** Our first-year retention rate remained strong at 91.5%, reflecting our ongoing commitment to student achievement and support. The four-year graduation rate remains robust at 70.8%, well above the national average.

These achievements demonstrate our continued strength in undergraduate enrollment and our unwavering commitment to creating a rigorous, inclusive, and supportive learning environment that prepares students to meet the workforce needs of Minnesota and the world.

I extend my gratitude to our devoted faculty, staff, students, alumni, and Minnesota community partners whose efforts are vital to our success.



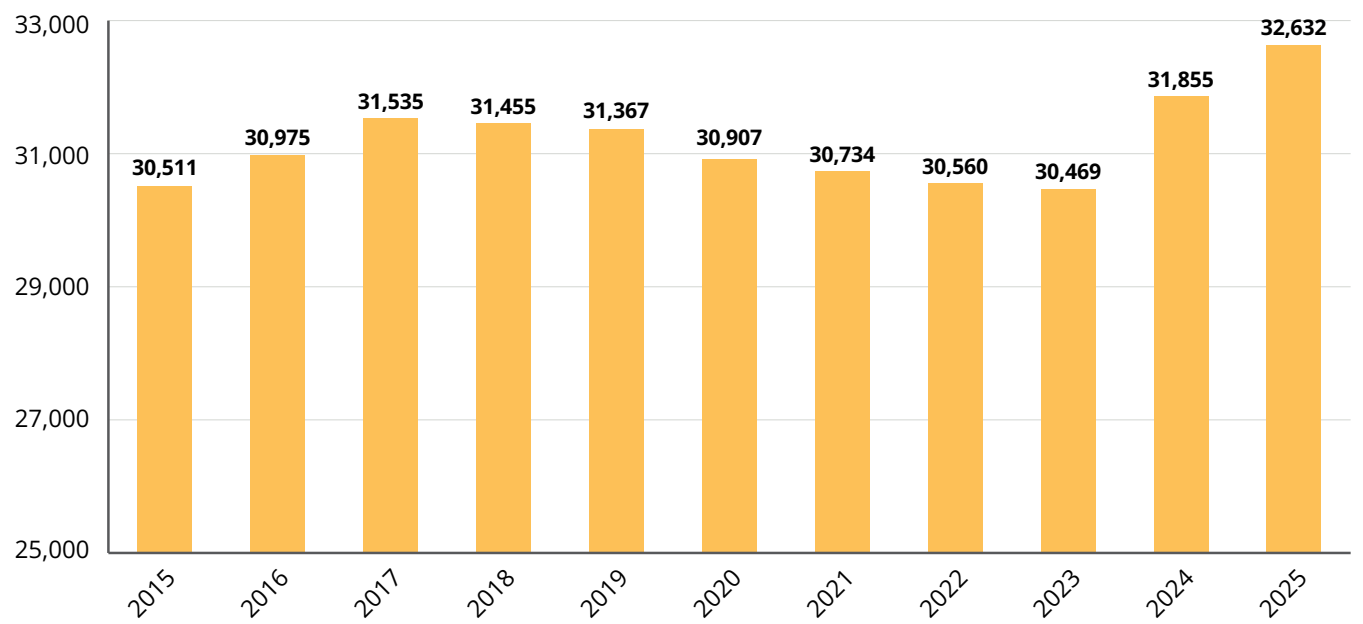

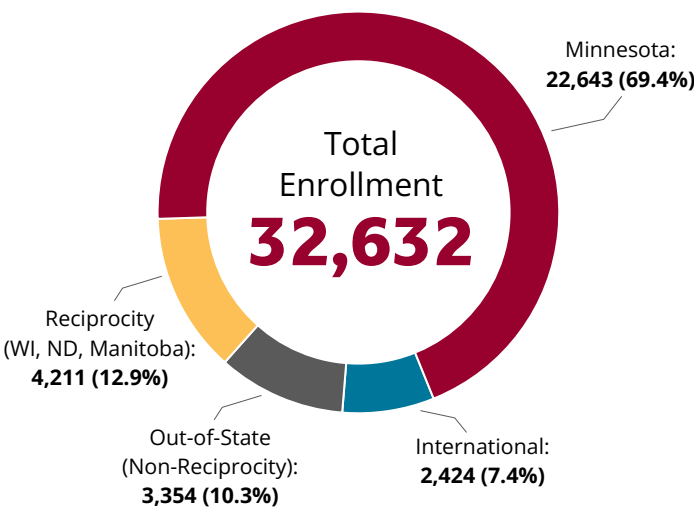


Undergraduate Enrollment

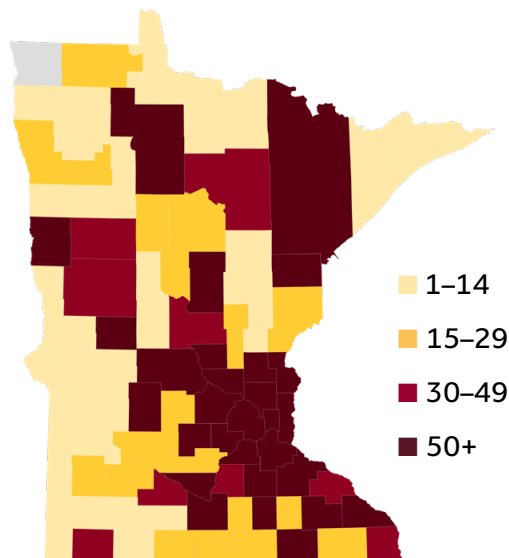

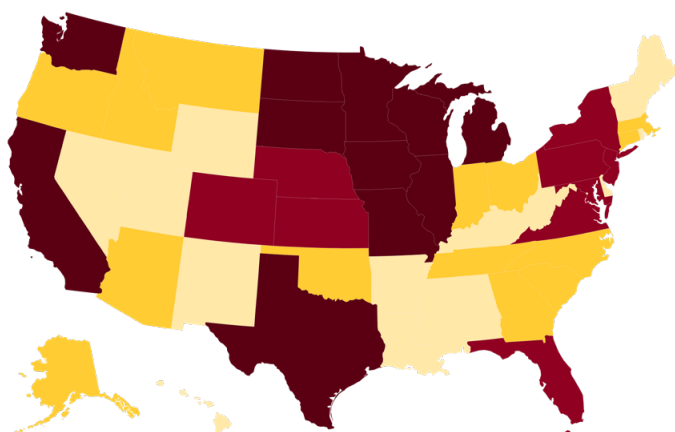

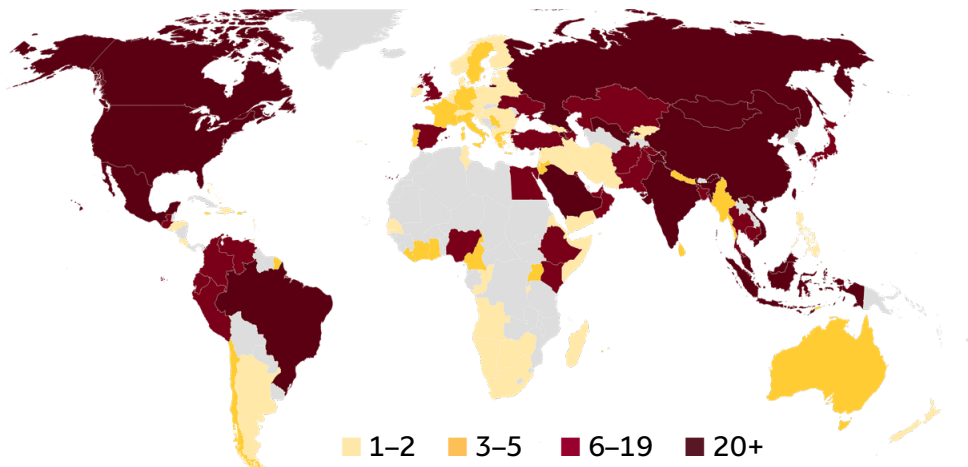

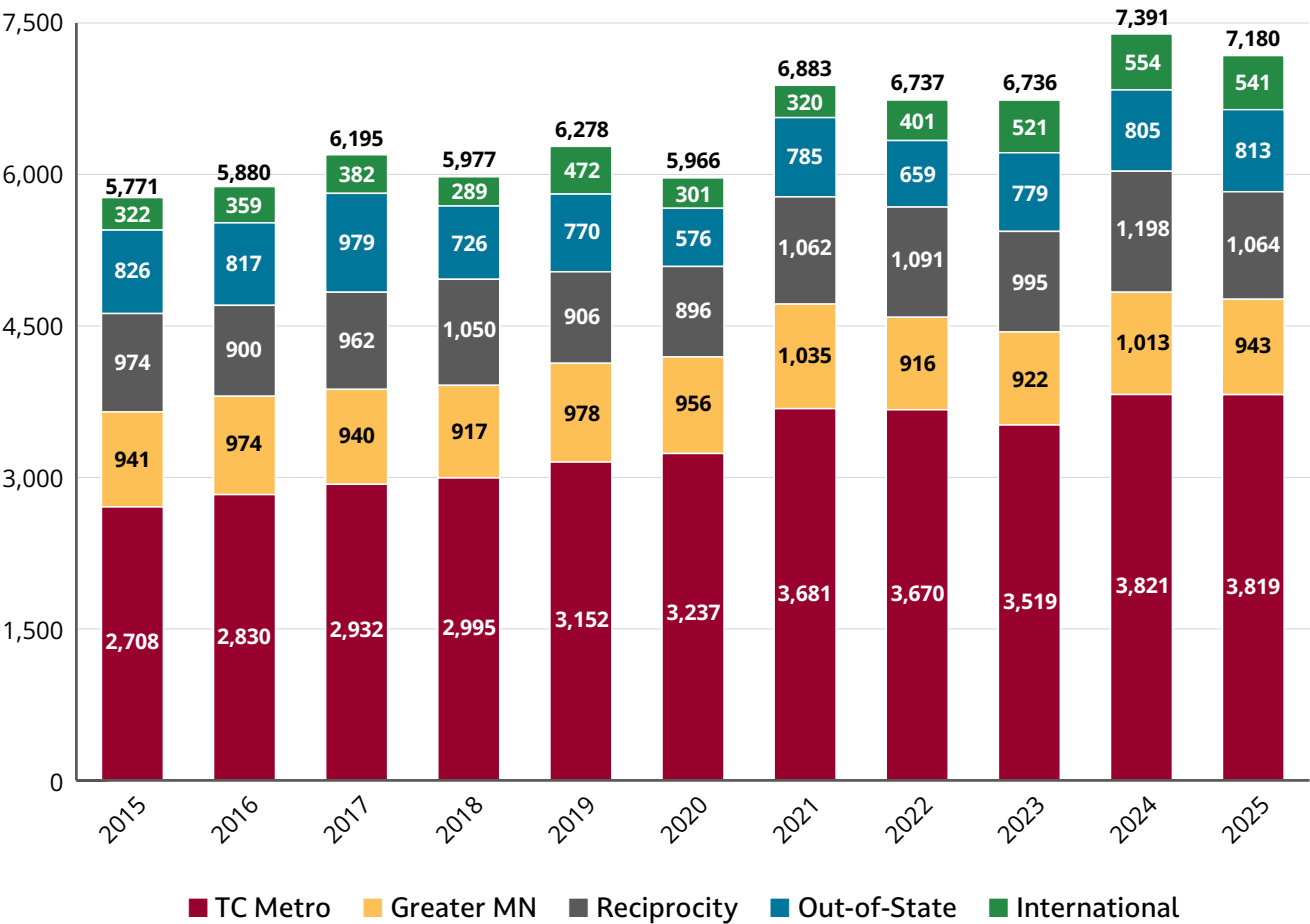

Twin Cities First-Year Enrollment



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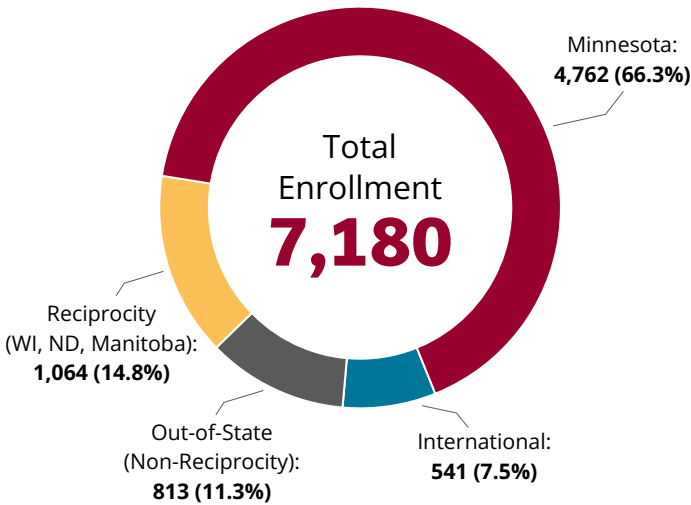

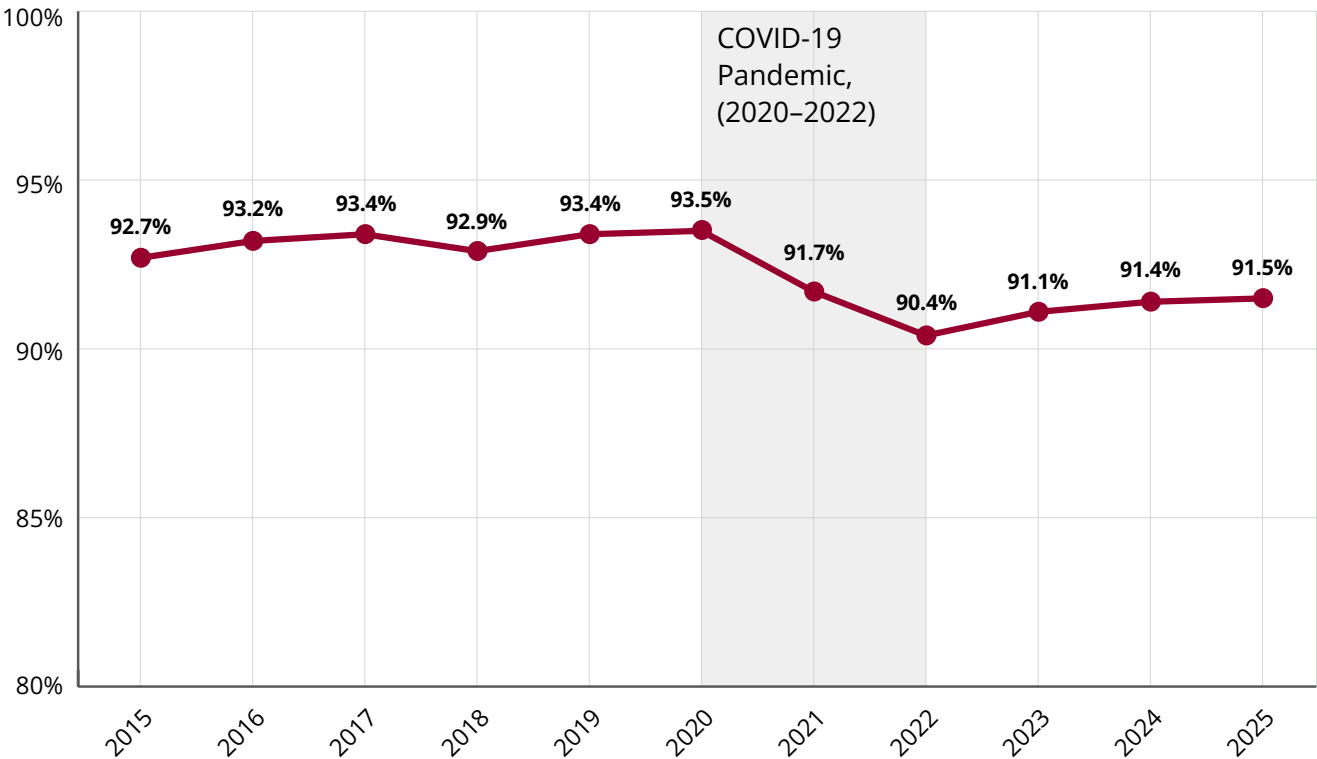

Twin Cities First-Year Enrollment BY RESIDENCY



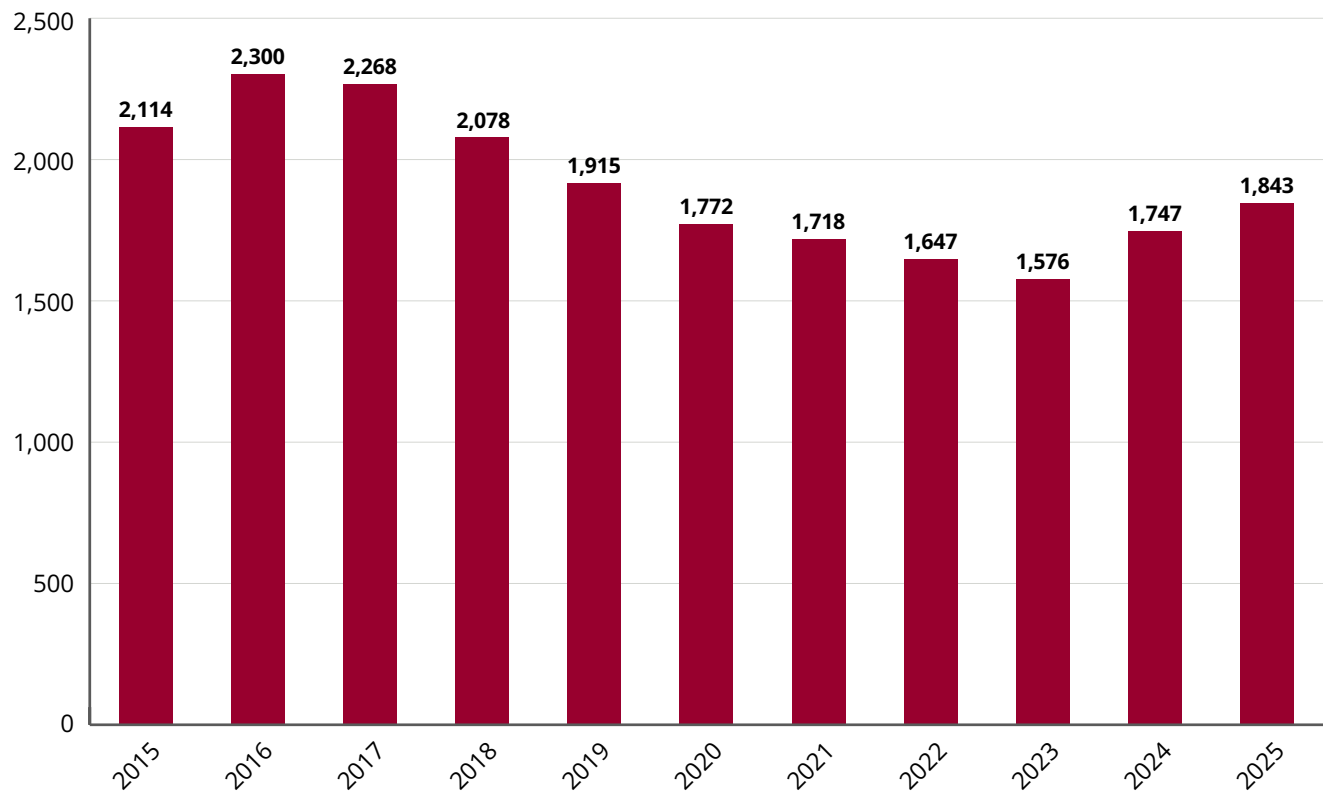
Twin Cities First-Year Retention Rate



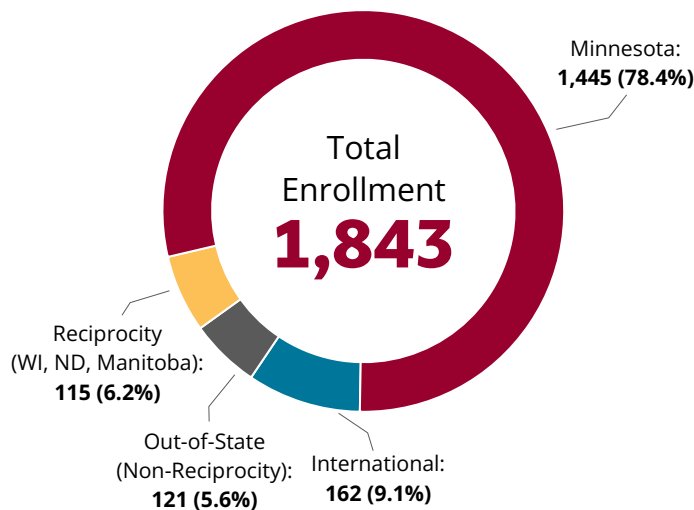
